Dear Parents/Carers,

Thank you all for your involvement in supporting our children. We have had a great first half term with many engaging and exciting learning activities.

Our topic this half-term is 'Changing Seasons'. We will be observing and creating pieces of work based around the changes across the four seasons. We will also use the key texts 'Room on the Broom' and 'Harvey Slumfenburger's Christmas Present' as these link to learning across the curriculum.

	Curriculum covered this half-term	Additional suggestions for home-learning
English	Text Focus/ Writing: story recall, story writing. Reading: Home reading, guided reading, and independent reading in class. Phonics: Set 2 and 3 sounds from Read Write Inc. Quick reading - applying these sounds with children when reading and writing. Spelling: Common Exception Words. Strategies for remembering how to spell and write them. Handwriting: Correct letter formation of lower-case letters including all letter families, 'Ladder Letters', 'Caterpillar Letters', 'One-armed robot letters', and 'Zig-Zag letters'.	 Write a recipe for a potion. What colour are your ingredients? Can you spell these adjectives? Discuss and read books about the different seasons and/ or stories that are set in different seasons. Read, learn and perform short poems. As you are reading with your child, 'spot' the words where you can find these long vowel sounds (ea, oi, a-e, i-e, o-e, u-e, aw, are, ur, er, ow, ai, oa, ew, ire, ear, ure). Maths	Number: Place Value (within 10) Number bonds to 10 and 20 Addition & Subtraction Geometry: Shape	White Rose Maths – Year 1 Autumn TERM: Week 6-10 (Addition & subtraction), Week 11 (Geometry) Maths home learning Home learning White Rose Maths
Science	Seasonal Changes Observe and describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies	Observe and talk about the changes that are occurring in our environment as the seasons change and how the clothing that we wear also changes.
History	Learn about Guy Fawkes and the Gun Powder Plot/Bonfire night. Order events in chronologically.	Discuss safety when using or observing fireworks. Observe fireworks, discuss the significance of the event in relation to the historical concept.
Computing	Creating media – digital painting. We will be exploring how to use digital programmes to create art work.	Practise mouse skills and using an online paint tools. https://paintz.app/
PE	Gymnastics will focus on developing stability, control and practising key movements such as different types of rolls and jumps. Dance will explore seasonal and topic themes through movement and body shapes.	Practise executing different types of jumps and rolls. Practise different balance poses such as standing on one leg.
DT	Textiles In this unit, pupils will learn how to sew pieces of fabric together to form a pouch. They will be able to thread a needle and use simple practical and decorative stitches.	Practice threading a needle. Discuss the names of different fabrics and materials such as, cardboard, polystyrene, hessian, binka and garden netting.
PSHE	Recognising, valuing and celebrating difference. We will discuss what acceptance and respect look like and develop an understanding of how we can show this. We will also discuss bullying and getting help when we need it.	Discuss ways in which we are all different and why being different is something to be celebrated.
RE	Meaningful gifts and the Christmas story	Discuss what you know about the Christmas story– do you celebrate this at home? How?
