- Year 3 sees the children <u>transition into Key Stage 2</u>. There is a big focus on building their knowledge and understanding of the world around them.
- Motivated- Work hard and try their best- Creativity.
- 'Make mistakes' take risks & learn from the mistakes- learning journey. <u>Self-regulation</u> to help build their <u>resilience</u>.
- We encourage an <u>independent</u> learning style in Year 3, where children take responsibility for their learning, using critical thinking, enquiry and investigative skills, along with self-initiative- <u>Persevere.</u>
- Preparing them for Year 4 and beyond- Timetables test.
- Our curriculum continues to be <u>cross-curricular</u>, making as many <u>links</u> as possible between <u>history</u>, <u>geography and science</u> to our English writing and whole-class reading. This approach provides a wider context to support children's deeper understanding of a topic.
- The children's <u>spelling</u> and <u>grammar</u> objectives also become more <u>complex</u>. We look at other patterns and techniques to aid correct spelling of the English language's less phonetic words! Weekly spellings will be sent home to practice.

# STEAM Focus (Professional Development) 2023-24

**Science –** Sustainability/ Climate change project which lasts throughout the year. Working with a group called The Garden Project.

**Computing** – New curriculum, new devices, children will be learning to code using the Scratch programme. The aim is to develop our digital leaders and creators.

Maths – WRH, TTRS, competitions, Maths week, cross curricular links. Hopefully this will lead to being confident mathematicians.

**STEAM Project-** Every Year group will organise a STEAM project at some point in the year .

**Events Week** based on STEAM where ch will carry out lots of activities based around these different subjects.

The Summer Exhibition will focus on STEAM and what the children have achieved.

- The year 3 humanities topics include London and the local area, a new history topic, the Maya civilisation. We also look at the Stone Age, Earth and Rocks, climate and biomes and the Ancient Egyptians.
- There will be lots of <u>cross-curricular links</u>, for example, in the <u>'Earth and Rocks</u>' Geography topic, the book the children study for English is 'Pebble in my Pocket' where they write a <u>scientific report</u> to inform their reader about how rocks are made.
- We will implement our exciting new DT curriculum this year. The children will work as designers on their textiles project, and they will also design and make bridges as part of their Structures unit.

### Home Learning on Teams

- Home learning will focus on <u>consolidation of knowledge and skills</u> such as reading, grammar, spelling, and Maths. At least <u>once per half term topic-based learning</u> will be set which will further develop the children's knowledge.
- We will set Spelling rules on <u>spelling shed</u> weekly (15mins) and please use <u>TTRS</u> to support their learning of the time-tables.
- Home learning will be set on <u>Thursday and to completed by Tuesday at 8pm.</u>
- We aim to: acknowledge and provide regular feedback about your child's work.
- Each section of the home learning has a time guideline; please encourage your child to keep to this time.
- We will provide a home-learning book for the children to complete their work in and then to take photographs to upload on to teams. If you do have an issue with uploading then please let us know.
- A few children will have adapted home learning.
- Please read our general notices regularly, this will inform you of assemblies, local trips, workshops and may include other messages of importance.
- We expect ALL children to complete their home-learning. If your child does not complete their homework on TWO consecutive occasions we will email you to explore why your child has not completed their home-learning.

• Your child must be <u>reading every day (20 minutes)</u>.

• <u>Change book day:</u> Mondays for Peacocks & Tuesdays for Parrots.

They should have a book to read at home and a different book, which they will keep at school that they will be reading. Our school library is quite extensive!


- Each year group has 6 books for the children to read over the year. These will be in addition to the children's whole class texts and reading books.
- Books are high level, engaging and at or above reading expectations for that year group
- The books include poetry, non-fiction and fiction.
- Outcome: Children will be asked to write a review of the book once read and submit as part of their homework on Teams. Each time a child has completed a review of the book, the child can ask the teacher to sign this off on their passport.
- All children who complete their passport before the end of the year will receive a Reading passport certificate which will be presented in assembly.

### Visits and Workshops GE

- We aim to provide at least <u>one trip/workshop per half term linked</u> to the current topic- please see our curriculum maps
- With the rise in cost of living we will be mindful of all our trip costs and use public transport and we would welcome as much help as possible.
- Letters will be sent out in advance (one month where possible) which include payments via ParentPay.
- <u>Interactive workshop about rocks</u> to support their Geography topic. They will mould their own fossils and even watch a volcano' erupt in the classroom!
- <u>The British Museum to deepen the children's understanding of the Ancient Egyptians</u>. Last year the workshop was all about studying artefacts and how they help us understand how the Ancient Egyptians lived.
- <u>The Hindu Temple in Neasden</u> his half term to support the children's understanding of their enquiry question, '*Would celebrating Diwali in the home and in the community bring a sense of belonging to a Hindu child?*'
- <u>A Science light workshop in the Summer Term.</u> This will be at school and is interactive with lots of activities for the children to take part in. They will learn how light travels, and the tricks light plays on us amongst other things!
- We are also hoping to go the <u>Museum of London in the Spring term to support the children's learning on the Stone Age.</u>

### Inclusion AA

- In the morning, TAs (one per Year group) will be in class supporting learning.
- Sometimes children will need additional support for a short period e.g. handwriting practice, extra phonics practice – this will be organised by class teachers and delivered by teaching assistants in the morning. This is part of Universal Offer.
- Some children (13%) will need support for longer or may have complex barriers to learning. In this eventuality, we will call you to discuss further support, assessment and ways forward.
- These children will then access a new type of support called SEN Support which is managed and supervised by Inclusion Lead – Mrs McMeakin. She organises termly review meetings and also has Open Day Meetings on the same days as Parent consultation days.
- Children accessing Special Educational Needs (SEND) provision will be entered in the SEND school census. Evidence-based SEND Interventions take place in the afternoon. A range of TAs will be delivering these.
- Only1%-2% of our school population will have high-needs support i.e. an Education Health Care Plan (EHCP). This provision is delivered by specialists or supported by peripatetic professionals.
